ZOOM – Kids on the Move

In 2015 more than 186,000 kids from 13 countries walked and cycled to school. Around 2,2 million such journeys have been collected as the children's „Green Footprints“ for a better climate.

City Cycling Campaign

Councillors act as models, promote cycling and involve citizens actively: More than 24 million kilometer were cycled by nearly 130,000 participants from around 340 cities in 2015 – a win-win campaign for local environment and global climate! stadtradeln.de

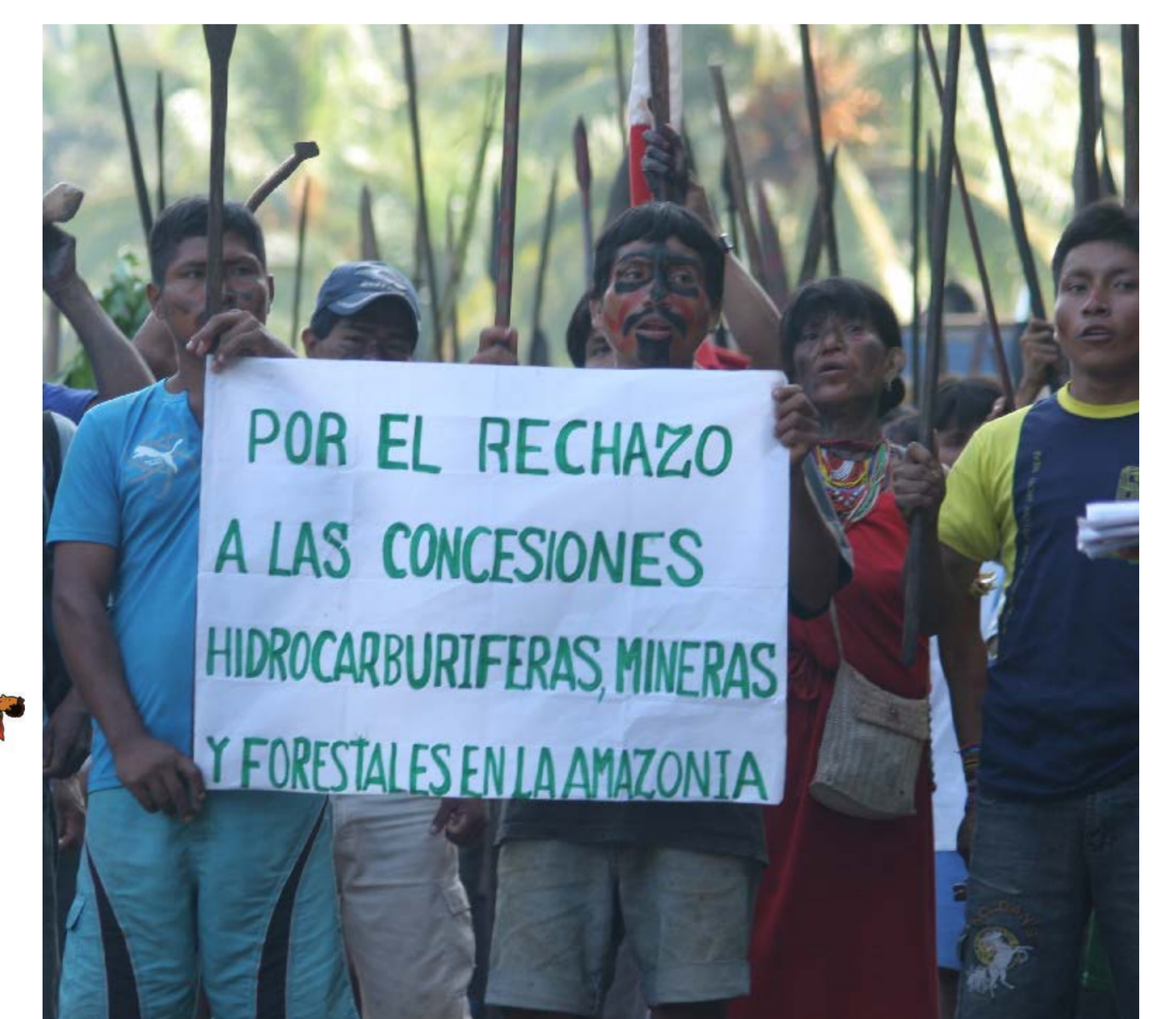
Partnering with Indigenous Peoples

- establishing direct and fair partnerships between indigenous peoples and local authorities,
- setting up community-based projects in the Amazon, e.g. renewable energies for local communities,
- project-independent legal aid fund for indigenous peoples.
